



Social-Moral Awareness Test (SMAT)

A simple to use test of social-moral awareness in people with learning disabilities.



- · can be used by practitioners working with people with learning disabilities to understand why the person is getting into difficulties in the social aspects of community living.
- will help the practitioner, together with other clinical information and observation, to understand whether the person has:
 - an understanding of how to behave in common situations
 - whether they understand why they should behave in that way because they know the 'rules'
 - whether they have a higher level of socio-moral reasoning and understand the thoughts and beliefs of others.
- simple to use, and quick to administer (approximately 15 minutes).
- uses 15 pictorial scenarios depicting a character "Pod" in a series of social and moral situations.
- examines socio-moral rule knowledge and socio-moral reasoning.
- it is anticipated that the tool would be an important aspect of care-planning and understanding people with learning disabilities' social and community interactions.
